

Park Closure per Harris County Requirements

In support of the Harris County Stay Home - Work Safe Order and the City of Seabrook health and safety initiatives, the parks in the Seabrook Island community under the jurisdiction of MUD 373 will have limitations placed on how the parks can be used. This Harris County Order is in effect from March 25 until further orders from Harris County.

The Seabrook Island parks will be open for walking and jogging. While in the parks, it is still important to maintain the social distancing requirement of 6 feet separation between people as recommended by the CDC.

Any of the actual physical facilities of the parks should NOT be used. This is to reduce the potential for transmitting the Covid-19 virus through contact if the equipment has been infected by another resident. The following items should not be used while the Harris County Order is in effect.

Do not use or contact:

Any playground equipment - this really means ANY playground equipment

Tables

Benches

or any other structures, barriers, etc. in the park.

Signs have been placed in the park to help remind residents of this order. While multiple signs and caution tape have been placed at various points throughout the park, it is impractical to place a sign or tape on every affected component in the park. You must assume that these restrictions apply to everything and not just the items with a physical sign attached to it.
